Financial Report: Jack Cunningham, Treasurer

Next month we will have a full year budget wrap up, but the holiday crawl was a success. We budgeted lightly and covered our expenses and then some for next year's crawl. We did achieve our full year advertising budget for the newspaper and exceeded it even without being able to do our full events schedule.

Cabbagetown-Reynoldstown Transportation Committee: Genevieve Barber, Chair (absent)

Traffic calming on Wylie - we last discussed the cost. Genevieve will be moving out of town soon, but we will have a new representative to help us out moving forward. A Wylie neighbor is concerned about white posts, which could be an eyesore. Still concerned about the cement posts, which are now being proposed. That neighbor is interested in a survey to gather information on what the community thinks. That neighbor would like to see a picture of the cement, which is actually going to look more like speed bumps. Alicia - we already had a survey and we have been using those results to create traffic calming. The neighbor commented that these comments may alleviate some of her concerns. Another neighbor noted that "rubber parking bump" is more like what is planned. Alicia will share the information on *Facebook* and *Nextdoor*. Will also provide an update in the newspaper. Another neighbor appreciated the tactical and temporary nature of the infrastructure and how quickly the project could be implemented or even removed if we do not like it. This is the first time the neighborhoods have been able to take control of their own infrastructure. We should ensure there is a budget to remove it as well if we do not like it. The neighborhood will have the power to make these changes. Stop sign at Pearl and Wylie: the City said no to this. Does not satisfy some requirements for ADOT. City also does not do mirrors.

Thoughts and prayers to the previous planner for NPU who was hit by a car at a planning conference with several others. Bond referendum has a lot of money tied to Cabbagetown, so it should be supported. Spring Tour of Gardens/Homes event, if we want to get permits, we should start doing so 90 days before the event. Have a great logo that has been designed for the event.


Hulsey Update

Bidlack As reported in our August 2021 edition, reliable sources told The Cabbagetown Neighbor that Hulsey Yard was on stand-by status to assist our nation with it's supply chain challenges. Over the next couple months, three mobile heavy-lift cranes were delivered and assembled at Hulsey Yard and preparations were made to return the Yard to a piggy-back operation concurrent with the Transflo activities.

For the past few weeks, container operations at Hulsey - just like the operations that took place prior to the yard's deactivation have returned, though on a comparatively limited scale. Georgia State Patrol has been providing security to the Yard, almost 24/7.

With all the supply chain issues this nation faces, it should not surprise us that CSX made this move. This writer welcomes the opportunity for Cabbagetown - and our surrounding neighborhoods - to do all we can to improve the situation.

Noise levels - along with truck traffic have increased modestly. CSX and Transflo appear to be doing all they can to minimize impact on surrounding neighborhoods. Our best guess is that once the supply chain is back to normal - probably by the second quarter of 2023 Hulsey will be deactivated again. Due to the long timeline and endless possibilities and factors, this prediction is nebulous at best.

I said, "You mean other my neighbor Kelle that I emailed you about?"





A Walk on the Wild Side. A couple in Quebec, were each fined ^{\$}1,500 on Jan. 9, when police spotted the pair walking outside about an hour after the city's 8p curfew, with the husband wearing a leash, CTV News reported. The city's COVID-19 curfew allows for dogwalking after 8p, but police rejected the couple's claim they were following the rules. It was the first weekend under new provincewide restrictions imposed by Premier Francois Legault, and officers throughout Quebec handed out more than 750 tickets.


Weird Science. Researchers have solved the mystery of how Australian bare-nosed wombats, produce poop in cubes, reports the International Business Times. Yen went to the hospital, but doctors told her to go home and see if the new accent would disappear in a few days. Nearly two weeks later, the brogue remains, and Yen is scheduled for an MRI and a visit with a neurologist. "I'm very lucky to have very supportive friends and family," she said. "If they find something hopefully there is a cure or treatment for it."

The Aristocrats. Rapper Lil Uzi Vert, whose real name is Symere Woods, revealed on Instagram in early February that he has had a ^{\$}24 million 10-carat pink diamond implanted in his forehead, reported Rolling Stone. According to Simon Babaev, spokesman for the New York-based jeweler Eliantte & Co. that implanted the stone, Uzi fell in love with the marquise-shaped diamond when he saw it in 2017 and has been making payments on it as he determined what he wanted to do with it. *"We didn't think he was serious about it,"* said Babaev, but as it became clear that he was, *"we engineered a specific mounting that clips and locks in place. There's a whole mechanism involved."*





The Stories We Write



We all write stories.

Stories not just of who we are, but of how and why we are. And with lots of memories to bolster our narratives.

Yet as we navigate the vicissitudes of our lives, ample research shows that we are not simply recording the events of our day on never-ending reels of memory. Instead, there is a rather vibrant – albeit largely sub-conscious – process of carefully culling which events, interactions,

experiences and memories we will save or discard as we compose the stories that come to define us. And while we'd like to believe that the stories we tell ourselves are the autobiographical outgrowths of our life experiences, it seems much more likely that a great deal of effort goes into creating the highlight reel that supports the life-narratives already in progress...

This process likely becomes measurably more intentional as we enter adolescence, a stage in which the way we are seen and experienced by others seems to take on much greater significance. The way our peers perceive us has a sometimes dangerously potent impact on the way we see ourselves. It is likely no coincidence that body dysmorphia and eating disorders often begin at this age, not infrequently giving rise to major depression and/or debilitating anxiety. In these vulnerable developmental windows, we are much more likely to select data points from our lives that feed a "confirmation bias" - selecting events and experiences that more readily support a conclusion we have already arrived at about ourselves, regardless of the actual validity thereof. If I have convinced myself I am a lonely introvert, I will curate a set of memories of life events that support that conclusion, conveniently discarding any recollections that might contradict such as outlying data points. If I have convinced myself that I am fundamentally unlovable, every past rejection will be imprinted as factual; each instance of being loved as coincidental.

Over the years, I've treated innumerable kids with ADHD and other learning differences who concluded they were "stupid" or "lazy." By

the time they reached middle school, they collected more than ample evidence to support their conclusions, conveniently negating any rare example of academic success as "dumb luck." This was their narrative, and they had the evidence to support it. For some of my most challenging kids, these were self-concepts that seemed to calcify over time. An identity was built around their brokenness.


Fortunately, most of us update our self-concept as we move healthily into adulthood. And with that, we signify different memories from our past, just as we de-signify others. In so doing, we keep our narrative up to date with our emerging selves. Essentially, we exercise some degree of agency over who and how we wish to be. We then adjust our stories to more effectively delineate the path to HERE.

We all know people who seem to see life through a lens of victimhood. They can recount every pitfall, every loss, every rejection. In their story, life never cuts them a break. Any exception you suggest is quickly met with a dismissive "yeah, but..." Their life narrative leaves little room for anything but suffering, abandonment, and woe. Over time, not so surprisingly, their story seems to become one of self-fulfilling prophecy.

At the same time, we know people who see themselves as survivors, rather than victims. They may have experienced many of the same injustices, but seem to instead compose a narrative that focuses on perseverance and resilience. Perhaps they attach a sense of purpose to all they have been through, rather than relating to their suffering as random.


These examples speak to the power of the stories we compose. And the significance thereof has direct relevance to how we parent our children (and ourselves.) It is recognized that one of the most meaningful and effective forms of psychotherapy is Narrative Therapy, which encourages the individual to re-visit and re-write the story of one's life through a lens of strength or survival, rather than reiterating a more passive voice. We can model this for our children, who are always watching what we do, but likely pay closest attention to how we behave when we are under enormous stress. The way that we speak about the hardships in our lives teaches our children alternate ways to think about adversity. While what we receive may not be within our control, how we receive it (and how creatively we reframe it) - this is very much where our agency begins. If we can model this for our children, the stories they write of their own lives will be ones that allow them to navigate challenges with confidence, resiliency, and hope.


