1. Atlanta Police Department - Lieutenant White

2. City of Atlanta - Council Person Liliana Bakhtiari

- Hole at Esther Peachey Park still needs to be addressed.

3. Historic Preservation and Land Use Elections

• Naomi Siodmok and Jacob Elsas have agreed to be co-chairs (interim until the elections in March). This is a position without

term limits. Both were voted in.

4. 768 Kirkwood (Pool)

 Pool proposal and parking concerns on the site. Considerations need to be made in order for this to be considered and allowed.
 Deferred until the beginning of the year. Applicant needs to speak with CNIA and HPLU. Applicant also need letters from the adjacent property owners. Check to see if they need to coordinate with Renoyldstown as well, since that is across Pearl St.

3. Liquor License and Community Agreement (97 Estoria)

- Will come to the Neighborhood Planning Unit (NPU-N) meeting on December 22nd. Dirga spoke with adjacent neighbors who are happy with the improved relationship.
- Concerns about neon in the windows. Voted to support.

4. NPU Grant Update

- Tactical urbanism lane on Wylie Street got a grant in March for this and since then, it was changed to staggered chicanes and flex posts on the south side of the lane. John spoke with DCP about next steps. Have ordered the materials and spent most of the money, but need to spend all by Dec. 31st.
- Waiting to hear back from the Department of City Planning to see if we can get an extension due to the work on Estoria and Wylie associated with Krog Street Tunnel.
- We will need another Transportation Chair or someone to help manage the project.






My apologies if that headline gives you bad memories. Lately – it seems - Atlanta is like butter, 'cuz we're on a roll.

"My artwork is very important to me because they come from me, it is from my own blood, my DNA is part of it," Circa said.

Lipp said he liked Antarctica best because he "got to ski next to the penguins." He hopes to nab a Guinness World Record for the accomplishment.

An Argentinian soccer superfan became alarmed on Dec. 13 as he headed home to watch his team's match with Croatia in the World Cup semifinals. The 53-year-old was frustrated at the slow progress of the bus he was riding, so when the driver stopped and stepped out to buy something at a kiosk, the soccer fan allegedly hopped into the driver's seat and took off toward his home. He drove about 4 miles, then abandoned the bus and its occupants and continued on foot. But police officers caught up with him and took him into custody – and he missed the whole game.

Art imitates death

Police officers in London were summoned to Laz Emporium, an art gallery, on Nov. 25 after a call about a "person in distress". In a gallery window, the figure of a woman could be seen slumped over, with her face in a bowl of soup. Officers broke into the gallery, only to find that the "woman" was a mannequin, and the scene was art. The American artist – Mark Jenkins – created the piece, titled "Kristina," on a commission from the gallery's owner, Steve Lazarides. Turns out these officers weren't the first to be fooled; paramedics were called out to assist the woman in October.

The name Karen took a big hit over the last few years, when it suddenly became synonymous with an entitled, demanding, complaining woman. But one British TV and radio personality can't bear to see the moniker disappear completely, so he has a plan. 

Winter Flowers are a special lot



We have been conditioned to think winter is bleak and gardens are barren and boring between November and March. However, Atlanta gardens can be beautiful in winter, and with a little planning you can even have flowers blooming. Most people are surprised, even shocked, when I come bearing bouquets of winter flowers from my garden. I enjoy the surprise and beauty the flowers provide, and wish I had room for more. They are a special lot.

A few of the winter-flowering plants you can include in your landscape are pansies, violas, paperwhites, Algerian iris, snowdrops, Bowles' Mauve wallflower, wintersweet, winter honeysucke, mahonias, camellias, winter jasmine, rosemary, fragrant daphne, hellebores, laurustinus, Clematis cirrhosa, flowering quince and Prunus mume. Thrift (Phlox subulata) is mainly a spring bloomer, but may produce a few flowers through the winter if planted in sunny, protected spots. Some candytuft varieties behave the same way.

Many winter flowers are small, concentrating their energies on pollinator-luring fragrances rather than large petals that may be lost to sudden blasts of frigid weather. Notable exceptions are camellias, which produce some of the largest flowers of any garden shrub.

Although I like flowering cherries, I wish more gardeners would plant Prunus mume (pronounced PROO-nus MEW-may), a related flowering tree that is just as beautiful but less well known. It is sometimes called mume or Japanese flowering apricot, but you are just as likely to hear it called by its botanical name. Depending on weather and variety, it will bloom from January to March. Some blooms may get killed by the cold, but more will open. It is sweetly fragrant.

Some winter-flowering plants such as Algerian iris and Clematis cirrhosa are hard to find and available from only a few sources. They, and other winter-bloomers are worth the search, however.

If you are unfamiliar with winter-flowering plants and how beautiful gardens can be in winter, visit a public garden in January. The Atlanta Botanical Garden is good place to start. Also consider the State Botanical Garden of Georgia in Athens and Massee Lane Gardens in Fort Valley (home to the camellia collection of the American Camellia Society.) And don't forget Oakland Cemetery. It has some excellent specimens of fragrant daphne (you really must smell it - wonderful), laurustinus, and Algerian iris as well as plantings of pansies and violas.


