Pickett to Berean people often turn the wrong way towards Gaskill. Response There will be a survey of signage and street markings next year, so we do not need to do these one-offs next year.
- Speed bumps on Estoria as a request.
- Q: Street lights are not the same on all streets Is anyone looking into lighting? A: Existing lights that are out/diminished can be reported to the office immediately and those will become LEDs. As for lights in general, those are being taken over by *GA Power*. If there is a need for more lights, they can explore the viability of that.





Musky Elon?

Electric cars, trips to space, Twitter -- it's never enough for serial entrepreneur Elon Musk. Now, Reuters reported, the joke's on buyers who snapped up 10,000 bottles of Musk's new perfume, Burnt Hair, in just a few hours -- at \$100 a pop. "With a name like mine, getting into the fragrance business was inevitable -- why did I even fight it for so long!?" Musk wondered on Twitter. The perfume is described on The Boring Company's website as "the essence of repugnant desire." "Just like leaning over a candle at the dinner table, but without all the hard work," it boasts. The scent won't start shipping until September 2023, so you can cross it off your Christmas list for this year.

More than just fingerprints

On Oct. 6, Burlington North Carolina police officers responded to a call around 7a, the News & Record reported. A homeowner told them that as he walked from his car to his front door, an armed man approached him and tried to force his way inside the house. UGLY NAME, PRETTY FLOWER



Many flowers have poetically beautiful names. Toad lily is not one of them. I love toads and welcome them in my garden, but they are not going to win a beauty contest, so you may wonder why a flower was named after them.

The most probable explanation is due to the spotting on the flowers and spots on young leaves of some of the species. The name definitely predates the age of marketing and advertising. We can be sure

no horticultural Don Draper was involved as the name is not one that entices brides to ask for it in their bouquets or for people to rush to buy it.

Despite what they are called, however, toad lilies (Tricyrtis spp.) possess an exotic and intriguing beauty and deserve to be more widely planted. Some people say the flowers remind them of orchids. Colors range from purple to white and yellow.

They are excellent perennials for shady gardens. They do best in partial or filtered shade rather than heavy shade. They prefer a well-drained soil that does not get too dry. Besides being attractive and durable, they bloom in the fall while most woodland flowers bloom in spring.

Hairy toad lily (Tricyrtis hirta) is the least euphonious of all (imagine a warty toad with stubble), but I think it is one of the best species in both looks and performance. "Hairy" refers to the pubescence on the leaves and buds. The Formosan toad lily (Tricyrtis formosana) is also a good choice. 'Autumn Glow' is a variety of the Formosan toad lily with leaves edged in yellow, providing extra color through the growing season.

Toad lilies combine well with hosta, Lenten rose, Solomon's seal, Eastern columbine, heuchera, epimedium, celandine poppy and green-and-gold (Chrysogonum virginianum). One of the best companion plants is hardy begonia (Begonia grandis) as it blooms in the late summer and early fall with pink flowers.

Visiting nurseries and public gardens in the fall gives you the opportunity to see plants you may have overlooked in the spring. Late bloomers such toad lilies and native asters that didn't look like much in April are in full glory in the fall. Seeing them may convince you to aim for having a garden that is as filled with flowers in autumn as it is in spring and summer. And, of course, fall is the best time to plant most perennials, shrubs and trees in Georgia.

This month, we spoke with Katie Butler, steward of Lando and Dewey, our first indoor-only subjects. Look at this baby. She's so friendly. That cat is named Lando because when she was at her foster home she was just like this: sexy, flirtatious – like Lando Calrissian of Star Wars.

And what about Dewey?

"Dewey had a different name when we adopted him, and we renamed him Dewey because of Walk Hard: The Dewey Cox Story, obviously. It's an important role that character played in our lives. But he had been returned twice. I think he just was really shy and the people who adopted him wanted a cat that was going to cuddle with them, and he didn't do that on day one, so they were like, this is a defective cat."

That's so sad. As we're speaking, he's hiding from us, so it's not totally unwarranted.

"He's especially suspicious of y'all. We've had him for ten years and only in the last two years has he started sitting with us on the couch. It took him that long to warm up. As long as we were presumably dead, he was comfortable sleeping next to us at night, but if we seemed like we might get up?— too scary. When we first brought him home from the foster home, he would go hang out on top of the kitchen cabinets, so we put a little box up there. It was a Sweetwater 420 case; this was circa 2012. We'd bring him food. Eventually he'd let us touch his head a little bit, but he was not happy about it. But then one night, Steve was asleep and felt something on his nose, and when he woke up he found it was Dewey touching his nose. Then he came down and decided to be normal."

Which foster program did they come from?

"They came from PAWS Atlanta. I wanted a black cat. We had just recently lost my other cat, Sydney, who lived with me longer than my first husband. She was a good cat. She outlasted several boyfriends and one husband. She was like, "Kick this one to a curb."

So after you met Steve, she was like, "Cool"?

"Yes! So we went to this woman's apartment in Buckhead. She had fourteen cats in a 600 square-foot apartment. There were several storage bins being used as litter boxes. She said, "Just sit down on the ground and see who comes over to you," and Lando immediately went over to Steve, and he fell in love with her like he does with all animals. So that's how we picked Lando, but we still wanted a black cat. We told the woman and she started showing us pictures of black cats on the website and said, "How about this

one? I know where he is." We say OK and she goes over and hits the back of her couch and out run three different cats. Apparently they'd made little holes in the underside of the couch and had been living inside it. Dewey was one of the escapees. He ran up onto this woman's cabinets, and this pair of tuxedo cats followed him up to console him, like, "Get it together, man. You're getting out of here. You've finally got the golden ticket." It was like Annie."

Apparently it's a scar where she got burned. There's still fur, but it's white now. It makes her a badass. Dewey was found as a kitten in a wall of a house that was under construction."

These are adventurous guys, but they're living out retirement in style. Any other factoids you'd like to share?

"If I'm playing a viola, they sit at the door and listen. I think they think there's a cat in distress. "Something's really wrong in there!"

For the first time ever, the traditional Day of the Dead Festival organized by the Consulate General of Mexico in Atlanta and the


Institute of Mexican Culture will take place at historic Oakland Cemetery on Sunday, November 6th from noon to 5p.

Annie Baker's "The Aliens" Comes to Community Theatre

A shared love for contemporary playwright Annie Baker brought the newly formed Bubble Theatre company together for next month's production of The Aliens, their first.

Despite the title, The Aliens is not a science-fiction, instead, "think of it as Waiting for Godot meets Beavis and Butt-Head." At least that's how actor Jack Pearson, 25 summed it to a reporter after rehearing in a park in Decatur.

For those unfamiliar, one is a dark and deep existential play by Irish novelist Samuel Beckett while the other is an *MTV* adult cartoon that first aired in the 1990's that one critic said, "turned stupidity into a crusade."

Or, if those touchstones don't click, "think realism," says Megan Parker, 28 who is directing the production. For her, the draw is the way Baker has captured the dynamics of male relationships.

"Everyone is just pretending, no one really knows what they're doing, and from the audience's perspective, you get to see that in a unique way."

For actor Nathaniel Gaul, 24, who first read the play over a flight to and from New Jersey, "everyone has a very distinct voice, but they all sounded like real people. And how she (Baker) works in silences, I think is interesting."

In this case, it's three guys hanging out behind a coffee shop who view one another as friends, role models or perhaps mentors.

Baker, who won the 2014 Pulitzer-prize for *The Flick* and in 2017

was named a MacArthur fellow, is known for her series of plays set in a fictional small town in Vermont. Premiered off-Broadway in 2010, *The Aliens* is one of them.

"Set and scenic and visual elements are going to be non-realistic but acting and production elements are going to be (realistic)," said Parker, adding "we're going for realistic timing." Set design will be

done by scenic Ash Bingham, resident scenic charge at Kennesaw State University. She has done scenic work for a variety of local theatres including *Horizon* and *Center Stage*.

The production has musical elements but is not musical theatre, Parker explained, noting that it's "an intimate play, (set) in an intimate space."

The production will be put on at the appropriately intimate Pinch 'N' Ouch Theatre in nearby Edgewood which seats 40-50.

The Aliens will play at the Pinch 'N' Ouch Theatre, 195 Arizona Ave NE w1, Atlanta. Showtimes are Dec. 9th and 10th at 8p, and Dec. 11th at 3p. Tickets are \$20 and can be reserved by contacting the Bubble Theatre company at *bubbletheatreatl@gmail.com* or on Instagram @*bubbletheatreatl*


Tie-dye flying high like a rainbow train with no brakes, there's plenty of smile smile smiles in the mid-afternoon for those willing to wander a little bit further.

"It isn't often that you are able to meet a doctor and assess their character without first being their patient; I am fortunate that I saw Dr. Elango in action. He was focused, calm, and steady. I am so grateful that the universe saw fit to put him exactly where he was most needed."

This isn't the first time that Dr. Mboh sprang into action and rendered emergency assistance to our neighbors. Believe it or not it has happened twice before. The first time was on Cherokee Avenue, again, very close to Grant Park. A child was slipping in and out of consciousness... Dr. Mboh just happened to be driving by and saved the day. More recently, Dr. Mboh came upon a motorcycle accident by the Chevron on Boulevard. "My instincts and training in emergency medicine allows me to be of assistance in these situations. At the very minimum I know what to do to stabilize the patient's condition while waiting on EMS." says Dr. Mboh.





REVERSAL REVERSED CHOMP PARKING INFO

According to John Ruch and Saporta Report, plans for a 165ft cell tower being built over Oakland Cemetery, Fulton Cotton Mill Lofts, The Stacks, and Cabbagetown are back on the drawing board because a state agency thinks there are no alternatives and visual impacts on historic sites are "unavoidable."

Many local neighborhood leaders are none-too-happy, and we probably won't be alone. More towers could be built across Georgia, as the developer is offering dozens more tower sites – including at least 18 within Atlanta – on railroad rights-of-way where a selling point is the lack of typical local government review.

Among the many critics of the tower's revival is Jacob Elsas, CEO of Cabbagetown's *Patch Works Art and History Center* and a descendant of the builder of the historic *Fulton Cotton Mill Lofts* and *Stacks Lofts* complex.

"If this tower is built," Elsas told SaportaReport, "it will forever change the surrounding landscape by introducing a ridiculously incongruous, monolithic oddity that comprises the visual integrity of numerous historic communities, many of which have worked extremely hard for 50 or more years to preserve their history."

According to John Ruch and Saporta Report, a company called *CitySwitch* is proposing the tower next to the cemetery and the lofts, both of which are historic landmark properties. There are several other nearby historic districts, including that of Martin Luther King Jr. Because of that, the project requires "Section 106 review," a report on historic impacts that is part of an approval process by the FCC. The ultimate comment will come from the federal Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, but statelevel agencies are responsible for collecting local input, which in Georgia is the state Historic Preservation Division (HPD).

RESCOM Environmental Corp., a consultant hired by CitySwitch to conduct a review of the historic impacts, in April submitted a report to HPD claiming there would be no "adverse effect." That claim was blasted by preservationists and by the cemetery's foundation, which said it was never told of the plan. HPD agreed with the critics, issuing an opinion in May that there would be adverse effects and that CitySwitch must consider alternatives or other sites.

Some of the consulting parties – including the Atlanta Preservation Center (APC) and Easements Atlanta, and Elsas's group – say they heard nothing more from RESCOM until October10th, when it announced in a terse, 45-word email that there were no alternatives and the state had agreed. The email did not include any other documentation of the alternatives. The builder says the main purpose of the tower is to "increase cell coverage" in the area because it is "underserved" and "patchy."

"From the proposal's onset, it's been clear that Rescom never intended to engage 'the public' in this discussion," said Elsas, citing the lack of input and an initial legal notice published in a little-known newspaper that does not circulate in the immediate area.




