- The status of money that was set aside for the community due to development impacts, is being looked into by Liliana to make sure the community gets what was set aside.
- In the future, let's work on community benefit agreements to have official documentation on what is owed to the community.
- Looking into permitted parking options for Cabbagetown to discourage people from driving to the Beltline, and to encourage alternative transportation.
- There might be an opportunity for this to generate revenue to improve the community. Will take a look at this street by street. If you know of other cities that have implemented this and have information to share, please do share with Liliana.
- Concerns were raised about overgrowth at Tye and Memorial and the need for maintenance for visibility.
- Watershed now manages issues with water meter lids if they are missing. Contact Liliana if you cannot reach Watershed.
- \$500,000 allocated for people facing eviction for access to Council.
- Reproductive healthcare fund has also been started by the City if anyone needs assistance.
- Partnering with *Community Foodscapes* to make *MARTA* stations less of a concrete wasteland and to hopefully increase ridership.
- Getting started on the Memorial Greenway in the next year. Idea is a linear park from Oakland Cemetery to Liberty Plaza.



This month we're mixing it up a bit coming at you with some of our favorite dishes where you might least expect them to be found. Unexpected jaaaaammsss (Google "Uncut Gems" if this doesn't immediately bring you back six months to the viral video of Julia Fox...).

First up is some of our favorite wings in town, at local brick oven pizza spot, Firepit Pizza Tavern. This place is surely known for their fresh baked tasty pies, but our go-to

order here generally is not actually pizza, it's wings. No knock on the 'za - especially the "Honey" - spicy capricola, caramelized onions, and honey ricotta. A very delicious contender, but we're here for the Unicorn Wings. The ingredients in the dry rub for the Uni wings aren't advertised, likely to maintain the proprietary genius that is these flavors but surely is an amazing combo. Our best guess as to what goes into the rub is their lemon pepper seasoning, parmesan, and something for some good heat like their calabrian oil. One of the best parts about these bad boys is that they stay extremely crispy since they're not drenched in sauce, yet they still pack the favor you crave. Don't sleep on these wings, I'm telling ya'. dippage. Of course you've got to get some sweets for the road on your way out, but whether you're there for lunch, or just to pick up something to-go, these tendies are sure to satisfy your taste buds.



Just across the 75/85 split, on the west side of town, you'll find one of our favorite spots for a unique asian inspired High-Ball cocktail, Little Trouble. Once you're there, sat, and ready to peruse the menu, you'll find a rarely offered, highly poetic item entitled, "Tempura Fried OREOS"! I was absolutely floored when I saw these, and of course didn't have any option but to order them. When these puppies came out, fresh from the fryer, still warm, oozing sugary Nabisco creme, I was in glutton heaven. Pair these with a Japanese whiskey drink or a Sake and you'll be alongside me, on cloud nine.

That just about wraps it up for some of our unexpected favorites. If you've learned anything from this incoherent rant of Stacy and Jake's favorite drunchies, I hope you've taken away the point that good food can be found anywhere, especially in places where you're not expecting it. You step into a Jewish bakery, smell the fresh croissant dough baking and flaking, your gaze is caught by perhaps a maple pecan cookie or a lemon bar, but then BAM you beeline it to their prepared foods counter for their Chicken Tendies. *Welcome to Alon's Bakery & Market*. You just might have to blindly trust us on this one and try it for yourself, because if you do, you'll have a new expectation on what chicken tenders should be from here on out. They serve them cold in their prepared foods section, and these fresh, crispy, chicken tenderloins are coated in their panko and SESAME, (yes, sesame seeds) and then served alongside a sweet chili sauce used for maximum

Not Stocked at Little's Food Store



Butterflies!



September is a good month for watching butterflies. Take a little extra time in the coming weeks to observe not only their beauty but also their distinctive behaviors.

For example, the hackberry butterfly, a masterpiece in browns and grays, sometimes lands on me for the salt in my sweat. The snout butterfly (a brave, little Concordeshaped butterfly) does this with even more regularity.

Hackberry butterflies, tawny emperors and red-spotted purples prefer to feed on the fallen fruit of my pawpaw trees than on any flower.

The many species of skippers have a darting, skipping flight pattern. They seem to jump into the air, and I cannot predict where they will land.

The buckeye's wings are mysterious with colorful eyespots. It is quick and nervous, so I rarely get an extended view until September when cooler temperatures slow the butterfly down and it basks in the sun.

I see few cloudless sulphurs in spring. In September I have had ten at a time brightening the garden and tussling with each other (or appearing to tussle) as they fly high into the air as if rising on a column of smoke.

Purple and orange are the favorite flower colors of most butterflies, but cloudless sulphurs prefer red. When feeding, the cloudless sulphur folds its wings and goes dead still. It looks like a yellowgreen leaf, a momentary camouflage.

The pipeline swallowtail is the jittery opposite. Its wings are aflutter when feeding. It is like a squirming four-year-old boy who won't sit still even to eat. Perhaps this action better reflects the iridescent blue on its wings, warning predators that it is poisonous.

These are just a few butterflies to watch for in the coming weeks. To attract more to your garden, plant nectar plants for the adult butterflies to feed on and larval host plants for the adults to lay eggs on and the caterpillars to eat. I'll talk more about these in an upcoming column.

If you're short on butterflies in your garden, visit Oakland Cemetery. With its native asters, hardy chrysanthemums and goldenrods, it is a prime location for butterfly viewing in the late summer and fall.



Cats of Cabbagetown: Kitten

He originally lived down the street, but when the owner had to move, she couldn't catch Pig the day she was leaving, so she just left a bag of food with me so I could feed him. Tragically, Pig eventually ended up getting hit by a car. and sneak up on her because she's vulnerable. I think that's why she stays inside the fence mostly. She can patrol in front of the house, but feels safe. Maybe protects her inside the fence.




LEE BAINS' NEW 'OLD-TIME FOLKS' ALBUM PROCLAIMS 'GOD'S A-WORKING MAN'

ANOTHER ANTENNA PROPOSAL




As you might remember, this past April, a company called CitySwitch proposed a 165-foot-tall cell tower on a piece of CSX land on Boulevard, right next to Oakland Cemetery, Fulton Cotton Mill Lofts, and The Stacks. Apparently, the plan was to include an antenna for CSX's own use as well as antenna space rented to cell phone companies.

According to John Ruch and SaportaReport, CSX is proposing

another antenna about 1,100 feet to the east, and located within Hulsey Yard.

Ruch reports that the new tower propsal calls for a 70-foot-tall antenna tower. A CSX consultant says the antenna will have "no adverse impacts" on historic sites. And just like that previous plan, some preservationists have their doubts.

"What we're very hopeful for is, this will not in any way conflict or



obstruct the historic fabric within which it finds itself being used," said David Yoakley Mitchell, executive director of the Atlanta Preservation Center (APC), expressing concern that the antenna "will affect the visuals of several historic communities." The new plan calls for a tower that is less than one-tenth the height of the originally proposed tower. The average utility pole in Atlanta is about 60 feet tall, so this newly proposed tower would roughly be the height of a utility pole. There are many light poles in Hulsey Yard that would be as tall (or even taller) as the newly proposed tower.

The new Hulsey Yard antenna plan does not involve CitySwitch or cell phone services. It is *"for rail operations communications only,"* according to CSX spokesperson Sheriee Bowman. Known as a "repeater," the antenna will *"improve communication with train crews during yard operations,"* said Bowman.

Bowman referred to the new antenna as "replacing" one already in Hulsey Yard, while the HDR report refers to it as an "addition" and "introduction" of a new facility.


The antenna itself would be 10 feet tall and sit atop a 60-foot pole. The HDR report says it would have *"a similar visual impact to a telephone pole,"* and notes the area is surrounded by walls, buildings and vegetation that could block the view.

Mitchell at the APC suggested that railroad antennas could be incorporated into new buildings in the quickly redeveloping area around the yard, which stretches roughly three-quarters of a mile between Cabbagetown and Reynoldstown/Inman Park. The yard itself has been the subject of redevelopment concerns and ideas in recent years. In 2019, CSX stopped using it for nearly a year, leading surrounding neighborhoods to commission a "master plan" for high-density redevelopment into a new community. But in 2020, CSX resumed freight use.

For now, the antenna is undergoing "Section 106 review," a report on historic impacts named for part of the federal Historic Preservation Act of 1966. Ultimate comment will come from the federal Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, but state-level agencies are responsible for collecting local input, which in Georgia is the state Historic Preservation Division.

Atlanta Police said they received a report of a sexual assault happening at an apartment near Gibson Street and Memorial Drive Tuesday at 12:41p on Tuesday, August 9th.




